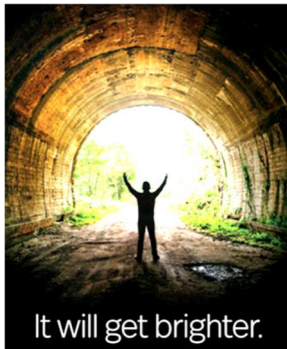


To Begin With: “The Light at The End of The Tunnel”



Those of us who know the tongue-in-cheek proverb about the light at the end of the tunnel will take comfort from the lack of a train track in the above picture. It is from a billboard that I saw at the airport two weeks ago with the CCS seniors.

For more than 30 years, the senior classes of CCS have ended their K-12 run with a special trip. Last year, that tradition was canceled due to the global pandemic shut-down. (I shared thoughts about that sad news [in a video](#) on the school blog last May, 2020, and stand by those thoughts 13 months later.)

This school year has proven to be a roller-coaster of ups and downs, openings and closures, dreams and disappointments, set-backs and milestones. Through it all, our school Covid protocols helped us mitigate many challenges, but one question loomed large for our 12th graders: would Covid cancel another Senior Trip? Like all the classes before them, this group had earned the trip -- literally and figuratively.

Plans were in place; planes were flying; lodging was booked; Disney tickets were in hand.... but still, after a

year of bracing for bad news, it was hard to remain optimistic.

Then it happened: In mid-May, the metaphor of the picture above came into focus. Following the data (and other states) Michigan dropped the mask mandate and social distancing for over half the state and announced fully opening on July 1. The timing of this good news felt like a gift from God.

On May 21st, twenty seniors and three sponsors loaded the school bus and headed to Grand Rapids (Thank you, Mr. Maine) and our 30-year tradition of Senior Trips resumed.

We enjoyed first-hand one of the most “open” states in the nation. Governor DeSantis has led the way in common sense responses to Covid’s many challenges. The beach at Clearwater was just as “normal” as it had been for the many other CCS classes who have spent the day there. It was the most “pre-Covid” world any of us had experienced in over a year. That sensation alone was worth the trip. This was true everywhere except in Disney parks where selective mask requirements flew like ghosts in the face of the science and data.

For instance, masks were not required in the Disney parks (thank heavens), but as soon as guests entered a rope line for a ride, a “cast member” sternly told them to put on a mask and cover their nose. Keep in mind, that long lines for rides now stretch along the public walk-ways—outdoors. Only a waist-high

rope separated the mask wearers in line from the thousands of unmasked passers-by inches away on the other side of the rope.

One of our goals as a school is teaching students HOW to think from a Biblical worldview (Phil 4:8). I am glad that they have not forgotten to wear their “thinking caps” even as they wore masks as needed this year.

While standing in these rope lines and the beautiful Florida breeze and sunshine the irony of this remnant rule was not lost on those observing it. Florida lead the nation in vaccinations for those age 65 and up; Florida schools had been open for in-person learning all year; and “the science” (and our seniors own personal experience) confirmed that their age group was the least at risk during the pandemic. These facts, along with daily improving CDC updates, meant that

virtually no one attending the parks—neither the young nor the old--had anything to fear beyond the Haunted Mansion or the Tower of Terror. The pharisaical nature and symbolism of this limited lingering mask mandate was confirmed as each ride ended and guests were free to immediately show their faces and breathe freely again as they exited side-by-side with countless unmasked strangers.

One thing this generation learned from the pandemic is how to put the feelings and safety of others ahead of their own and to [jump through hoops](#) with a smile. You would have been proud of our seniors for wearing masks when asked to with the same playful spirit of children wearing mouse ears. After all, this was the world of Disney... where pretending is half the fun.

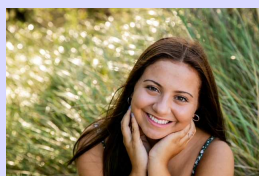

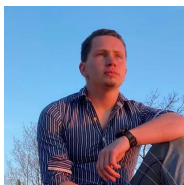
The Senior Class of 2021

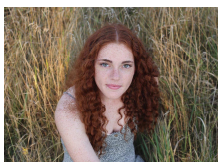

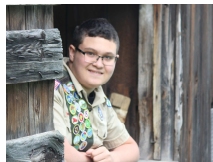
