FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOLS



I was deeply honored at our Commencement Ceremony two Fridays ago when Patrick Colunga presented me with six "memorial stones" (large boulders that can only be carried one-at-a-time). He said that "the Bible uses the number seven to represent *perfection* or completion, and we plan to give you the seventh stone some time in the future as you continue to work on behalf of CCS in a different capacity." Patrick's kind words and the symbolism of the stones were timely and appreciated. The night before, I had published my last post on the CCS administrator's blog:

"To Begin With..." It was about twelve memorial stones that represent significant

years in the history of CCS. Our school board chairman knew I would appreciate how he described my career as meaningful and not yet complete. He summarized my 42 consecutive years in K-12 Christian education: One year at Heritage Hall, Muncie, Indiana; eighteen years at Walnut Ridge Academy in Waterloo, Iowa; and twenty-three years here at Calvary Christian Schools. My new role involves launching the soon-to-be expanded Eagle's Nest Childcare Center (from part-day preschool program to also include all-day care). This expansion is a strategic step to better serve like-minded families while also maximizing our resources (and strengthening the budget) to help undergird the entire K-12 program.

In the months between now and our 45th Anniversary 2025, I will also be sharing the need for CCS in this community and the importance of becoming a mortgage-free ministry. We have been blessed with a 60-acre campus and beautiful building that cost nearly ten million dollars just two decades ago. Through God's providence and the stewardship of hundreds of donors, that has been paid down roughly 80% in twenty years. We are also blessed that the interest rate on that mortgage is around 4% for two more years. Even so, our monthly mortgage payment of \$15,000 is a hindrance to much higher priorities we have for this educational ministry. Maximizing our resources and becoming mortgage-free will be the initial goal of this new role beginning July 1st. I am thankful for this opportunity to continue to serve Calvary Christian Schools.

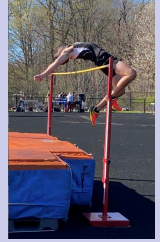


Kamea Kyon Sutherland
