Kids Read Now Outcomes

The Kids Read Now program kicked off in May 2019 at each elementary school building in the Grand Haven Area Public Schools (GHAPS) district. The purpose of the kickoff event was to distribute the first three books to each student in kindergarten through third grade. Parents were also invited to

attend to learn more about the program and learn how they would be involved. School administrators organized the books, and GHSF's Executive Director, Hannah Olechnowicz, helped



hand out the packets at Robinson Elementary, where she recalls "all the smiling faces on the kids as they pulled the books out of their packets."

The program was very successful and we wanted to share the data with you so you can see how your donations helped so many kids:

- GHAPS outperformed other first-year schools in every component of the program.
- GHAPS exceeded the average participation rate (57%) with a 69% participation rate.
- GHAPS exceeded the average number of books students read in the first year (between 5 and 6 books); GHAPS had an average of 7 books read per active student.
- A total of 7,301 books were read.
- Nearly 65% of students grew or maintained their reading level.

Mary Jane Evink, Director of Instructional Services, Grand Haven Area Public Schools, noted, "We are excited not only for the high number of students who grew or maintained, but



also because the average loss—or slide— was a fraction of what is expected over the summer."

This year the Michigan Department of Education did not offer a subsidized rate, making it too costly for us to fund every kindergarten through third grade student. The GHSF board decided to identify students who are the most at-risk in reading, and we'll be funding 397 students across our seven different elementary buildings for Kids Read Now 2020!
