Our Board has grown recently with the addition of four new members, increasing our breadth and depth of expertise, which will be leveraged to propel the organization forward. I wish you could witness the incredible energy during our

8:00 a.m. board meetings. Working with this talented group is inspiring and holds much promise for the future!

We have established new, and nurtured many existing, connections throughout the Grand Haven Area Public Schools (GHAPS) district and community at large. We are in the middle of long-term strategic planning, which has helped to strengthen our mission, and has uncovered new opportunities to support students throughout the community. We can't wait to share more on this topic soon.

During the first six months of this year, we have been able to support six new kindergarten through fourth grade initiatives providing \$36,000 in funding. Thirty-four students received full-tuition scholarships to attend preschool through the Grand Haven Preschool Development Program. The research describing the benefits of attending preschool is compelling, and we remain committed to providing financial support for three- and four-year-old students who otherwise would not be able to attend.

None of this would be possible without the passion and leadership that Susan Bays brings as our Executive Director. Susan joined us just over a year ago, and she is an incredible asset to our organization. If you haven't met her yet, I hope you are able to in the future.

Meet our new Executive Director



The Board of Directors is pleased to introduce Susan Bays as its Executive Director. Bays has been leading the Foundation in its mission to support education initiatives that increase school readiness, as well as help define and support additional programs within the Grand Haven Area Public Schools (GHAPS) since June 2021.

"We are thrilled that Susan has joined the Grand Haven Schools Foundation. Susan brings incredible creativity, energy, and strategic thinking to the organization. With Susan's leadership, the GHSF is positioned to continue making positive impacts in the lives of our young students and their families," said Foundation President, Brandon Reame.

Bays spent six years working in Human Resources, most recently as an HRIS Analyst. Prior to that, she was an Educational Consultant for Usborne Books Tri-Cities and brought the Reach for the Stars Read-a-thon to our local schools to help spread literacy. Bays has a degree in Marketing from Michigan State University and many years of experience in the field.

"I am thrilled to be serving as the Director of the Grand Haven Schools Foundation," commented Bays. "Supporting early education initiatives is critical in laying a strong foundation for student success. I enjoy partnering with the GHSF board, staff at Grand Haven Area Public Schools, and our community to help make a difference in the lives of our area students."

Bays and her husband, Jeff, reside in Grand Haven with their daughter, Kaitlyn. Their son, Scott, works as a software developer, while son Matthew is a rising senior studying at Michigan State University.

\$36,000 Grant Award

GHSF Awards \$36,000 to support K-4 Initiatives

The Grand Haven Schools Foundation (GHSF) has announced \$36,000 in grant awards to support Grand Haven Area Public Schools (GHAPS) K-4 students. GHSF Executive Director Susan Bays explained, "These one-time awards are in addition to the ongoing support that the foundation provides to the GHAPS Preschool Development Program, including the provision of 700 preschool scholarships since 2005."

"We are so excited about what the foundation has accomplished this year," shared Bays, who noted the grants will help broaden the Foundation's support to include grades K-4. Bays met individually with principals at every school to better understand areas of greatest need. "These grants go straight to the heart of what Success for All is all about, and address important needs within the district," shared GHAPS Superintendent Scott Grimes. "We are exceptionally grateful for the Foundation's ongoing support."

The grants include funds for the following programs:

- GHSF awarded a total of \$13,000 to support ongoing math interventions and address gaps in math proficiency. A new district math coach will attend Math Recovery Training and bring that knowledge back for district-wide implementation, complemented by math manipulatives that put proven, hands-on learning tools in students' hands.
- The Educational Field Trips Grant provides \$2,000 to bolster Ferry, Griffin, and Lake Hills elementary schools' field trip fund. During her school visits, Bays learned that Title I elementary schools often lack the financial support to provide field trips, so this money will

help bridge a significant gap for the students in these schools.

- The \$7,000 Trauma Informed Grant provides seed money for K-4 classroom teachers to create or enhance their classroom "safe spaces." These calming, comfortable areas are stocked with tools for students to use when experiencing big emotions or other barriers-- allowing the student to emotionally regulate without leaving the classroom, and reengage in learning smoothly when they are ready.
- New Teacher Classroom Library Books Grant provides \$500 for each new K-4 teacher in the district to stock their classroom with their favorite library books right from the start.
- Finally, the Dyslexia Professional Development Grant provides school psychologists and instructional coaches with training aimed at uncovering these learning challenges and providing students with the supports needed to be successful.





Preschool Scholarships

GHSF Preschool Scholarships...Making an Impact for Local Students and Families

- GHSF has provided over 700 preschool scholarships to students of lower income families since 2005.
- One-third of those attending the Grand Haven Preschool Development Program (PDP) in the 2021-2022 school year were supported by full tuition scholarships funded by the Foundation.

The Grand Haven Schools Foundation continues to support three- and four-year-old children with critical early learning opportunities to help ensure kindergarten readiness. Through funding full tuition preschool scholarships, GHSF helps ensure preschool access for children in our community, regardless of economic background. This initiative continues to be an important strategic focus area of the Foundation.

Art at the Yard Returns

After a year pause due to the pandemic, Art at the Yard returned in October 2021. The event welcomed hundreds of guests to view artwork by thirty local artists. Held at D. Baker Lumber and Sons, Art at the Yard was hosted by the Lakeshore Visual Arts Collective (LVAC) and the event benefited the Grand Haven Schools Foundation (GHSF). Funds were raised for the Foundation through door donations as well as a 10% margin on all art sales throughout the evening. The event brought in over \$10,000 for the Grand Haven Schools Foundation.

"Art at the Yard is a testament to the success that is achieved through collaboration with other local non-profits," commented Susan Bays, GHSF

Executive Director. "The support GHSF has received through this event has helped area children access preschool scholarships and has also funded other initiatives in kindergarten through fourth grade. We are grateful for our partnership with LVAC, the artists, and the opportunity to be involved in this wonderful community event each year."

A variety of artwork was displayed throughout the lumberyard. Guests enjoyed an open bar as well as music at the venue. A rotating roster of artists are selected each year from the membership of the Lakeshore Visual Arts Collective (LVAC). Art at the Yard is one of the signature events of LVAC which seeks to create a sustainable artist community by partnering with

businesses, community organizations and private individuals to create diverse visual arts events.

"Art at the Yard has grown each year since it began," explained Maggie Bandstra, founding board member for the Lakeshore Visual Arts Collective. "It is wonderful to be part of something that exposes the immense talent in this community and draws people together for a great night in support of great organizations like the Grand Haven Schools Foundation."

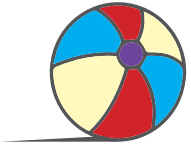
