It's hard to believe that the Grand Haven Schools Foundation (GHSF) will be celebrating its 30th year as a nonprofit organization next year. A small group of dedicated community members started the Foundation to help support a first-class education for the students of Grand Haven Area Public Schools (GHAPS), and address any gaps in learning.

During the past three decades, your Foundation has made an incredible impact on thousands of students and their families, and the trajectory of this incredible Foundation is more promising than ever.

Last year, we completed a 5 year strategic plan and quickly transitioned into implementation mode. We added five new members to our board during the 2022-2023 school year, resulting in a dynamic group of committed, focused, and talented collaborators. A refreshed brand that better communicates our vision and mission is rolling out during the next few months. You may have noticed the new logo on this newsletter. We have an incredible team working together to lay the groundwork required to do our most important work yet, which is to help support a quality education for our students.

During the past academic year, the Grand Haven Schools Foundation has provided nearly \$99,800 in grants to support a variety of meaningful initiatives. For example, 40% of students attending the GHAPS Preschool Development Program received full tuition scholarships from the Foundation. We also supported large grant initiatives related to math recovery training, math manipulatives, and decodable books for our early elementary students to help address learning gaps in math and reading. For the first time, the Foundation has increased its support to include Pre-K

through 12th grade initiatives. This was achieved through our new GHSF Mini Grant Program, which allows teachers and staff to apply for \$500 mini grants to support learning opportunities in the areas of Math, Reading, Behavioral Tools and STEM.

Preschool Spotlight

GHSF Celebrates Kate Augustyn's Preschool Influence

The Grand Haven Schools Foundation (GHSF) has a proud history of supporting preschool by promoting early education for all children and providing scholarships to families in need. This philanthropic choice is intentional. Not only does research show preschool makes a significant impact on school readiness, but it also predicts life-long success in education, careers,

and relationships.

Kate Augustyn, Special
Education Director at
Grand Haven Area Public Schools
(GHAPS), will retire in June of 2023,
leaving a legacy with preschool and
early childhood education. Under
Kate's service, the Grand Haven
Schools Foundation has funded
nearly 800 full tuition preschool
scholarships since 2005.

Kate has been an advocate for preschool education all of her professional life. She received a Bachelor's degree in Music and Education, and a Master's Degree in Early Childhood Special Education. During a practicum at Children's Memorial Hospital in Chicago, she co-facilitated the opening of Tuesday's Child, an organization which provides training for parents of preschool children. This organizational model was successful and grew quickly. Kate explains, "My experience provided clarity about the importance of developmentally-appropriate preschool and the positive impact it has on a child, a family, and a community."

Kate's passion for early childhood education is rooted in the delight of teaching the basic building blocks of learning and socialization. "I want children to love learning and to believe school is fun," Kate shared.

Additionally, if challenges of learning can be detected early on, there is an opportunity to address them and have the greatest impact for intervention and remediation.

Once Kate landed in the Grand Haven Area Public Schools Special Education office, she worked in partnership with Lana Jacobson, Emeritus Board Chair of the Grand Haven Schools Foundation. In the formative years of the Foundation, the primary mission was to make preschool accessible to all families. Together they grew the GHSF endowment, and increased awareness and programming for three- and four-year old children. Under Kate's leadership, Grand Haven Area Public Schools transformed the preschool program from a daycare to a comprehensive preschool, with research-based curriculum and teachers who specialize in early education. Congratulations to Kate Augustyn on her retirement and a job well done!

Surprises Local Teachers with

\$42,000 in Granted Wishes



The Grand Haven Schools Foundation (GHSF) surprised Grand Haven Area Public Schools (GHAPS) staff and teachers at celebrations across the district this spring. GHSF board members arrived in pairs at 10 of the district's campuses with certificates and giant checks to announce \$42,000 in grant awards.

"We are forever grateful for our supporters," says GHSF Executive Director Susan Bays. "Their generosity is directly impacting important, quality initiatives that benefit students

and empower learning. We've been working hard to expand our reach and as the endowment grows, we want our impact to grow as well."

For the first time, the GHSF used an application process to award mini grants of up to \$500 to teachers and staff in all grades. This is an expansion of last year's preK-4 grant funding. Over \$11,500 in mini-grant funding will back specific teacher requests in math support, reading, books, behavioral incentives, STEM materials and more.

The GHSF also announced several larger grants to support a variety of district needs. "Collaborating with principals and instructional coaches, we were able to identify some important common requests," says GHAPS Curriculum Director Mary Jane Evink. "We appreciate how mindful the foundation is about using their resources in ways that directly benefit Grand Haven students." Among them are decodable books for early-elementary classrooms, math

recovery professional development, and hands-on math manipulatives for elementary classrooms.

In total, the GHSF has provided more than \$99,800 in grants and preschool scholarships this school year, increasing its financial impact on initiatives that directly improve academic readiness and success for all.

In the fall, the GHSF surprised each of the district's 11 new K-6 teachers with a \$500 grant to begin building their classroom library. Title I elementary schools Mary A. White, Ferry, Griffin and Lake Hills, each received \$2,000 to bolster their field trip fund. This is the second year these grants were made possible by the Grand Haven Schools Foundation.

Full-tuition preschool scholarships represent a significant portion of the foundation's giving, making high-quality

preschool available to nearly 800 families since 2005. "Quality preschool programs improve kindergarten readiness and set these young learners up for success from the start," Bays explains. This year, the GHSF awarded more than \$43,000 in tuition scholarships, allowing 31 preschoolers to attend the GHAPS Preschool Development Program despite financial barriers.
