Last spring, we welcomed GHSF supporters, parents, school staff and local leaders to join us at the GHSF 30 Year Breakfast Celebration to kick-off this milestone.

# GRANN GHSF Impact Grants Increase Student Achievement Across the District Spoot ght

The Grand Haven Schools Foundation has awarded over \$27,000 in grant funds over the past two years to help support Math Recovery training for district Math Coaches and provided math manipulatives for students in the classroom.

Sara Cooke, one of two Elementary Math Coaches at GHAPS, was the Foundation's keynote speaker at the GHSF 30 Year Breakfast Celebration last spring. Sara shared, "With the support of GHSF, we have been able to impact professional learning, empower teachers in instructional shifts and increase student achievement."

The Math Recovery training helped deepen the coaches knowledge on how students develop understanding around numeracy and allowed teachers to shift away from memorization and rote procedures towards a deeper understanding of mathematical concepts.

"GHSF funding allowed us to purchase math manipulatives for teachers in the classroom. Through the use of hands-on tools and games, students are building a strong foundation of number sense, and we are seeing an increase in joy and engagement. These supports have led to a positive impact on student achievement," shared Sara.

At the conclusion of Sara's speech, she thanked those who support the Foundation and make grants like these possible. "The work we are doing right here in Grand Haven Area Public Schools is making an impact not just day to day, but lifelong. As a district, the data clearly shows that we are moving in the right direction."

- Despite learning loss due to COVID, our math scores are showing an upward trend.
- We are 9 percentage points ahead of the midyear national average on the iReady benchmark assessment.
- In regards to our benchmark assessment scores, we are exceeding the national average in math for every grade level.

Additional support from GHSF grants and the collective efforts from GHAPS Math Coaches are directly benefiting students. As scores are rising, students are finding joy in their math journey. Thank you to all the GHSF donors who make these grants possible.

"Through the use of math manipulatives like counters, unifix cubes, 10 frames, and bead racks kids are creating a much more solid foundation of number sense. With manipulatives, they SEE the math concept. Having different tools allows each student to find what works best for them. We have embraced that all brains are different, and giving students ownership in finding the tool that works best for their brain is really empowering." – GHAPS Teacher
